The Great West Way - aka the A4

VisitWiltshire has secured Round 1 Discover England Fund support to develop *The Great West Way*, with the ambition of creating one of the world's premier long-distance touring routes between London and Bristol.

The project is currently operating under the working title *The Great West Way*, and aims not only to connect some of the most iconic visitor destinations in England - including Windsor, Stonehenge, the Cotswolds, Bath and Bristol - but also to reveal new places and experiences along and around the route.

The objective is to create a world class tourism experience for visitors - however they choose to travel. *The Great West Way* project is designed from the outset to be multi-modal, attracting road, rail, canal/river and cycle/walking travellers.

Ultimately, the project will encourage visitors to tour and explore more of the region, to experience less-well known places, slowing and lengthening visits to grow the visitor economy.

The Pewsey Vale Partnership, together with Crofton Beam Engines, are ensuring we are involved in this project - being so close to the route and having so many of the features they are looking to include, the Pewsey Vale should benefit from being part of this.
