



The Rose of Hungerford is a traditional canal boat offering public and private trips for 45-50 people along the Kennet and Avon Canal from Hungerford Wharf. The Rose is owned by the Kennet and Avon Canal Trust and run entirely by fully trained volunteers. This means that all funds raised go to the Trust to help maintain historic buildings along the Canal, including Crofton Pumping Station.

The Rose and her volunteers always offer a warm welcome to passengers as do the other venues in this joint visit initiative. You could always combine your trip on The Rose with a visit to see the fascinating Beam Engines at Crofton, Merchant's House in Marlborough or the Wilton Windmill to make an enjoyable and interesting day out.

The Rose operates public trips from the end of March to the end of October and also runs the popular Father Christmas trips in December. There are various special trips throughout the year such as Cream Tea Cruises and Musical events. Private Charters can be booked at any time of year, daytime or evening, subject to availability, for a variety of events and parties. The boat has large picture windows down both sides and at the front which slide open in fine weather but also has central heating if it is a little chilly. There is a fully licensed bar on board serving hot and cold drinks and snacks, an electric wheelchair lift and cloakroom.
